

ARP ESSER Health and Safety Plan Guidance & Template

Section 2001(i)(1) of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires each local education agency (LEA) that receives funding under the ARP Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund to develop and make publicly available on the LEA's website a Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan, hereinafter referred to as a Health and Safety Plan.

Each LEA must create a Health and Safety Plan that addresses how it will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff, and which will serve as local guidelines for all instructional and non-instructional school activities during the period of the LEA's ARP ESSER grant. The Health and Safety Plan should be tailored to the unique needs of each LEA and its schools and must take into account public comment related to the development of, and subsequent revisions to, the Health and Safety Plan.

The CSIU Health and Safety Plan outlines the Intermediate Unit's processes and procedures in response to prevent, mitigate, and respond to COVID-19 with the goal of providing in-person learning to the greatest extent possible for the 2022-2023 school year. The CSIU understands that if there are cases of COVID-19 in the community there are no strategies to eliminate transmission risk within a school population. As a result, the CSIU may reference PDE's and PA Department of Health guidance related to closure of a classroom or school building due to COVID-19 transmission rates based on the level of regional/local community spread,

The CSIU provided in-person instruction for the majority of the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years and all of the 2022-2023 school year by following the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC and the PA DOH. The CSIU will continue to offer in-person instruction for the 2023-2024 school year. The CSIU will do our best to provide for the health and safety of all students and staff knowing that we want to provide in-person instruction to the greatest extent possible. The chart below outlines the specific measures that will be taken to provide for the health and safety of students and staff.

The CSIU will provide in-person instruction to the greatest extent possible. The CSIU will continue to provide one-to-one electronic devices and utilize a learning management system to the greatest extent possible so that instruction can seamlessly continue even if moved to a virtual format. Educators at the CSIU will stay connected and aware of students' academic and social emotional needs in both the in-person and virtual environments knowing that we will be in-person to the greatest extent possible.

The CSIU works with students' home districts to ensure that all students have access to health and food service in both in-person and remote instructional settings.
